
UN DAY CLIMATE ART EXHIBITION AND COMPETITION RULES

1. Age Groups

- Entries will be judged in two different age categories as follows:
 - Students aged 7-13 on the day art work is received by UNESCO-CEPES
 - Students aged 14-18 on the day art work is received by UNESCO-CEPES

2. Types of art work and sizes

- Only art work submitted in the following categories will be accepted:
 - Paintings (any medium) (minimum A3)
 - Drawings (pencil or charcoal or crayon) (minimum A3)
 - Sculpture (any medium) (no size restriction)
 - Photograph (minimum A4)

3. Method of Submission/Selection

- Works of Art (paintings, drawings, collages, photographs, sculptures) can be submitted either by post or in person before the deadline
- Submitted works should be ready to be displayed
- Only one piece of work can be submitted by each student
- Joint works of art will not be accepted
- The judges reserve the right to pre-select artworks to be included in the exhibition/competition
- Regrettably submissions cannot be returned by the organizers. However works can be collected from UNESCO-CEPES by the artists/schools following the exhibitions.

4. Competition Entry Forms

- Each entry MUST be accompanied by an Entry Form ([click here for Entry Form](#))
- Entries received with out an Entry Form will not be exhibited or entered into the competition

5. Exhibitions

- By submitting their artwork, students and their schools agree to the organizers using their work for public exhibitions both during the official UN week and subsequently.
- Schools will be informed by the organizers of the date and place of any further exhibitions involving their schools pieces of art work.
- By submitting their art work students and schools agree for their name, artwork title and school name to be entered in a souvenir catalogue of the exhibition.

6. Judging and Prizes

- The decision of the specialist judges is final and no correspondence regarding decisions will be entered into
- Winners who are not present at the prize giving ceremony will be informed in writing by the organizers
- It is the responsibility of the winners to collect their prizes from the organizers.

7. Press Relations

- By submitting their art work students and schools agree to their names and art work being feature in any media or press relations regarding the Competition and/or exhibitions.

8. Opening and Prize-Giving Ceremony

- All students and schools submitting art work are automatically invited to the opening prize-giving ceremony on October 23rd . (Click here for details).
- Students and schools attending either of the ceremonies do so at their own risk. The organizers accept no responsibility for accident or losses incurred on its premises.
- No official invitations will be sent to participating students or schools.

9. Dead line for submission of Work

- Only pieces of art work received by UNESCO-CEPES by **Friday October 16th 2009 at 17:00** will be considered for the exhibition and competition.
